

UNIQUE WAY OF PRSERVING OUR PAST

Mary B. Garr has written a story titled,

"A Labor of Love, A Tribute of Reverence."

It tells the story of how Len Towell has chosen to memorialize the life of his father, Leonard Towell, by piecing together the history of his parents' past and commissioning Erie City Memorials to etch it in stone. At the right is a wood-burning (etching) rendered by his mother Olga showing the old homestead. This along with wood carvings made by his father and other memorabilia tell about Leonard and Olga's 58



years together. Len has created, along with the skilled artists at Erie City Memorials, a very unique tribute to his parents.

The monument was recently erected at the Wintergreen Gorge Cemetery just in time for the first year anniversary of Leonard's passing on April 24th. Anyone can visit the graves to see this permanent monument and tribute to Leonard and Olga's lives together. The original artwork and photographs used by Len and Eric City Memorials to create this monument, along with additional historical information will also be on display at the Iroquois Branch Library throughout the month of May.
